Hong Kong Cancer Fund Annual Review 2013-2014



Message from Founder & CEO



Dear Donors, Supporters and Friends,

To fulfil our mission that no one faces cancer alone, Hong Kong Cancer Fund aims to serve the community with comprehensive, holistic care. We are delighted to report that in the financial year 2013, we helped more people than ever before.

Our network of support was extended throughout Hong Kong with the implementation of new initiatives and service programmes. It was extremely rewarding to provide our clients, their caregivers, family and friends with the necessary information and skills to face any challenges that arise on their journey.

More than 116,000 visits were recorded at our three support centres in the community, a 9% increase compared with the same period last year, and the number of registered users grew by the thousands, totalling over 17,000. Our young adult programme, YOU CAN, continues to receive tremendous interest

since its creation in 2011. The number of young adult clients rose by 24% and the number of their visits also increased by 300% this year. Providing age-appropriate care is one of our top priorities and we support YOU CAN members by boosting their self-confidence to prepare them for any challenges ahead.

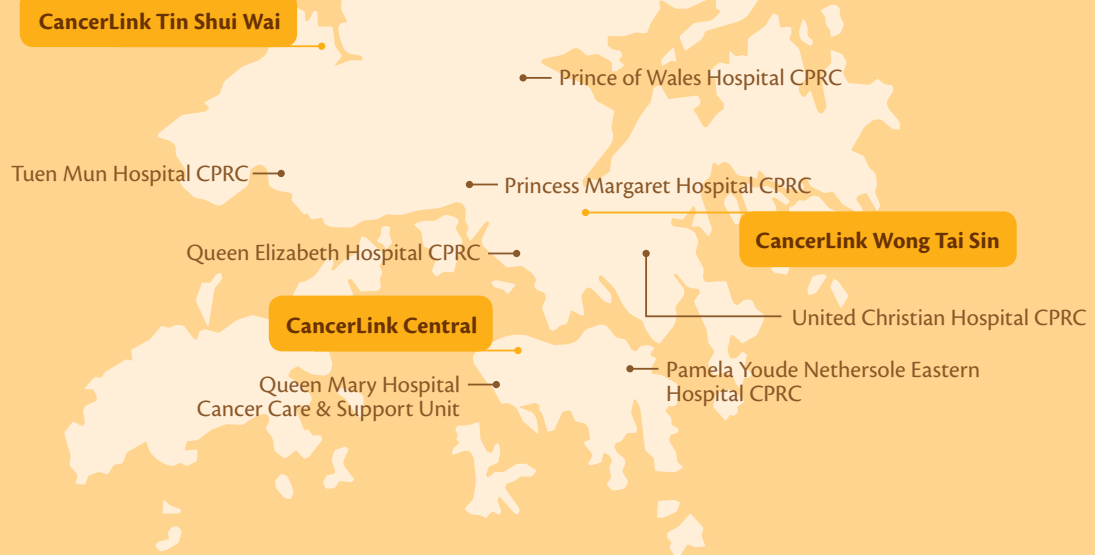
Medical and psychosocial support was equally in demand this year, as demonstrated by the 57% increase in nursing consultations and 22% rise in the total number of clients served. Our programmes catered for a diverse range of social groups, featuring new initiatives which included a men's art therapy group and rock climbing for young adults.

Our hotlines continue to be a popular means of communication, allowing the public to reach out for information and emotional support. Among the 15,000 calls we received this year, almost three quarters were first-time users, enabling us to provide support for more people on their cancer journeys.

One of the areas which we are most proud of is our holistic services. Our wellness programmes nurture the mind, body and spirit, through a wide range of workshops, therapy sessions, retreats and classes, helping to rebuild our clients' self-esteem and confidence. This year the number of programmes we offered has significantly increased by 100%, the number of sessions by 93% and total attendances rose by 60%. Our wellness team is devoted to broadening our scope of work in the years to come.

Developing our Circle of Friends fundraising programme was of great importance and we are thrilled to report that our annual income grew by 15% with the help of our generous donors who support us on a monthly basis.

OUR SUPPORT NETWORK



As the incidences of cancer continue to rise, emphasising early detection will be a key focus of our education campaigns. We hope to bring cancer under control by continuing to invest in clinical trials, early screening and research, driving forward advancements in treatment to provide our community with the necessary tools and knowledge to lower the risk.

None of our achievements would be possible without the generosity and dedication of our supporters, professional staff and volunteers like you. Thank you for believing in our mission. As we look ahead, we will work toward expanding our Wong Tai Sin Support Centre and implementing cutting-edge programmes and services to provide the best care and support for everyone living with cancer.

Who We Are

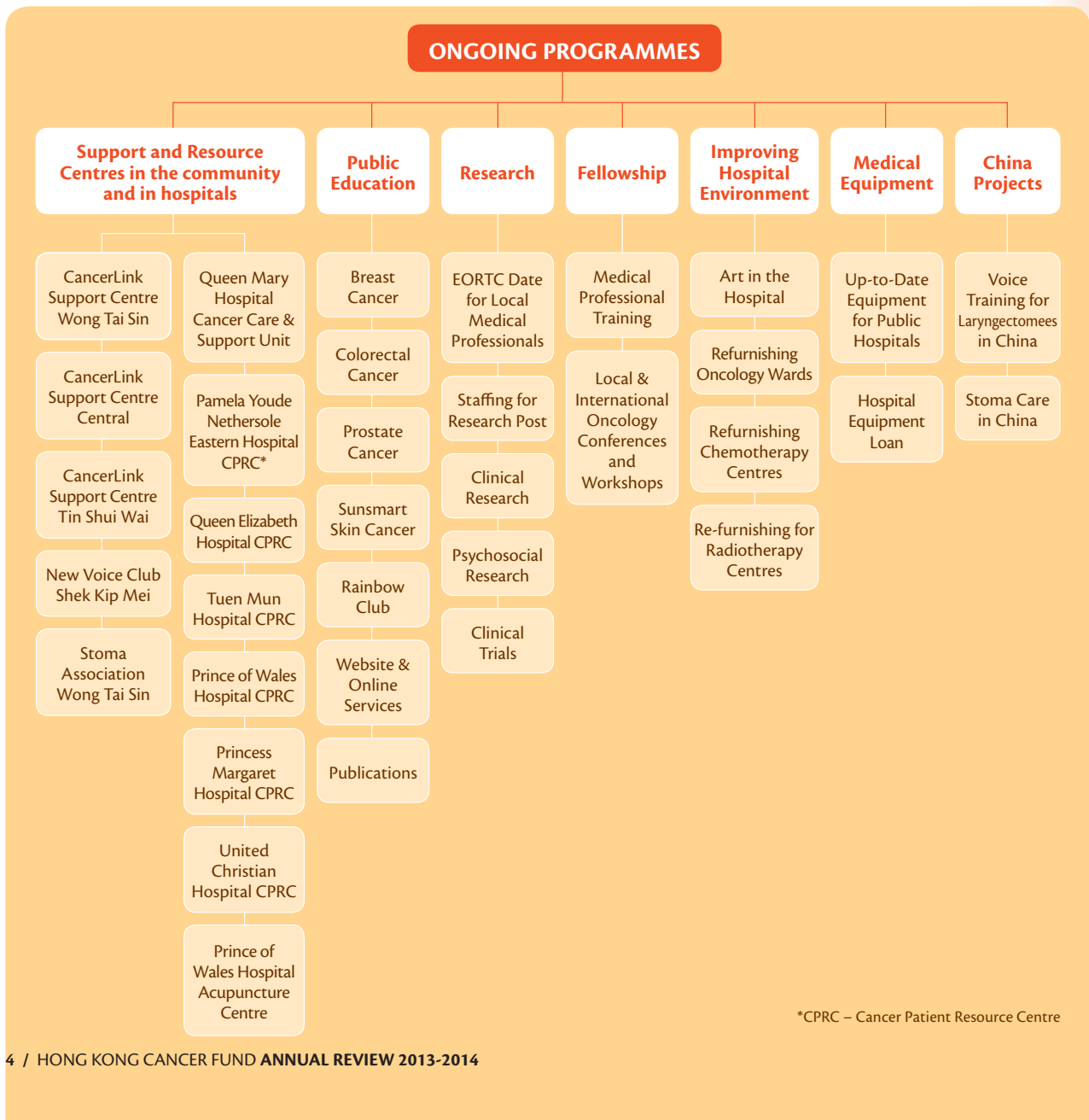


Hong Kong Cancer Fund is the city's largest cancer support organisation, providing free information and professional support to anyone affected by cancer. With a network of free support, spanning the hospital, the home and the community, our mission is to ensure that no one faces cancer alone.

How We Helped in 2013-2014

113,751 visits to our Cancer Patient Resource Centres in the 7 cluster HA hospitals around Hong Kong – an oasis where clients and their families can relax and access essential resources



14,869 people received comfort, information and advice through hotlines managed by our social workers and nurses



161 clients benefited from direct practical and emotional support as part of our home care service, a **10%** increase from last year



698 young adults received age-appropriate support through our YOU CAN service, and visits increased by **318%** from last year



3,743 Reach to Recovery packs were delivered to those undergoing treatment for breast, prostate and nasopharyngeal cancer



HK\$2,022,210.9 worth of financial assistance was offered to those in need through our Relief Fund

3,921 visits to our nursing service, a **57%** increase from last year



1,480 Cancer Fund Rainbow Club children were cared for throughout the year, an increase of **21%** from last year



8,978 clinical counselling visits to help clients deal with the emotional consequences of living with cancer, a **22%** increase from last year



39,305 visits to our psychosocial workshops and therapeutic groups



We helped **116,216** members at our community support centres, a **9%** increase from the year before



14,420 cancer survivors and clients are part of our Friends of CancerLink peer support network



HK\$5,133,914 was invested in cancer research



21,732 wellness programme visits helped cancer survivors find peace of mind, a **60%** rise from last year



Year in Review 2013

April We collaborated with Procter and Gamble (P&G) for the 6 Minutes Protect a Life campaign to raise awareness about female cancers and highlight the importance of maintaining health through regular, preventative check-ups. We offered free breast and cervical screenings to encourage women in Hong Kong to make female health a priority.



May Cancer support is enhanced with our renovation of the Department of Clinical Oncology in Pamela Youde Nethersole Eastern Hospital to upgrade facilities, including the reception, patient waiting hall and medical consultation rooms, to provide a more relaxing, positive environment to promote healing.

June Sunbathing is a popular pastime during Hong Kong summers which is why our 'Be SunSmart' campaign in partnership with Cancer Council Australia again was so vital for promoting sun protection, and increasing awareness on the danger of tanning. We worked together to promote a range of safe, quality skin care products through a variety of channels to reach out to the city's sun-worshippers.



July 'Don't Wait Till it's Too Late' was the slogan for our colorectal cancer campaign to remind those over the age of 50 about the importance of screening and early detection. Over the years, our promotion of colorectal cancer awareness has engaged public interest and the number of visits to our dedicated colorectal cancer website rose by 22% compared to the year before.

October 'Check Regularly' was the theme for our 12th Pink Revolution supporting women touched by breast cancer. Internationally acclaimed diva Coco Lee joined forces with us again to promote early detection and encourage participation in Dress Pink Day. We raised close to HK\$3 million for our free comprehensive breast cancer services, including a discounted mammogram offer for low-income, high-risk women, and a public health talk.



We received the Best Practice Award in Social Welfare from The Hong Kong Council of Social Service for our home care service. Cancer Fund was among 89 other projects nominated in the prestigious competition, of which only 18 were awarded. Thanks to the help of our professional team and volunteers, this initiative made people with cancer who felt neglected, feel loved and valued. We improved the quality of life for clients in the later stages of cancer, and provided their loved ones with much-needed support.



November Over 2,500 loyal supporters and cancer survivors joined our 18th annual walkathon, Stride for a Cure, and helped us to raise over HK\$4.4 million. Funds from this fun-filled event in Tai Tam went towards important cancer research projects in Hong Kong, including clinical trials, vaccines, screening programmes and groundbreaking treatments to help bring the disease under control.



Wellness Programmes

Our wellness and holistic health activities provide physical and mental benefits for cancer survivors. These include yoga, qigong, tai chi, promoting positivity and bringing comfort and joy to their lives. These programmes are open to anyone touched by cancer.

Our support centres run a wide variety of holistic and complementary healing practices to encourage and inspire survivors to live a meaningful, positive and healthy life. These practices are the perfect complementary therapy for clients, to help lift their mood, promote better sleep, and ease pain, fatigue, stress and anxiety.

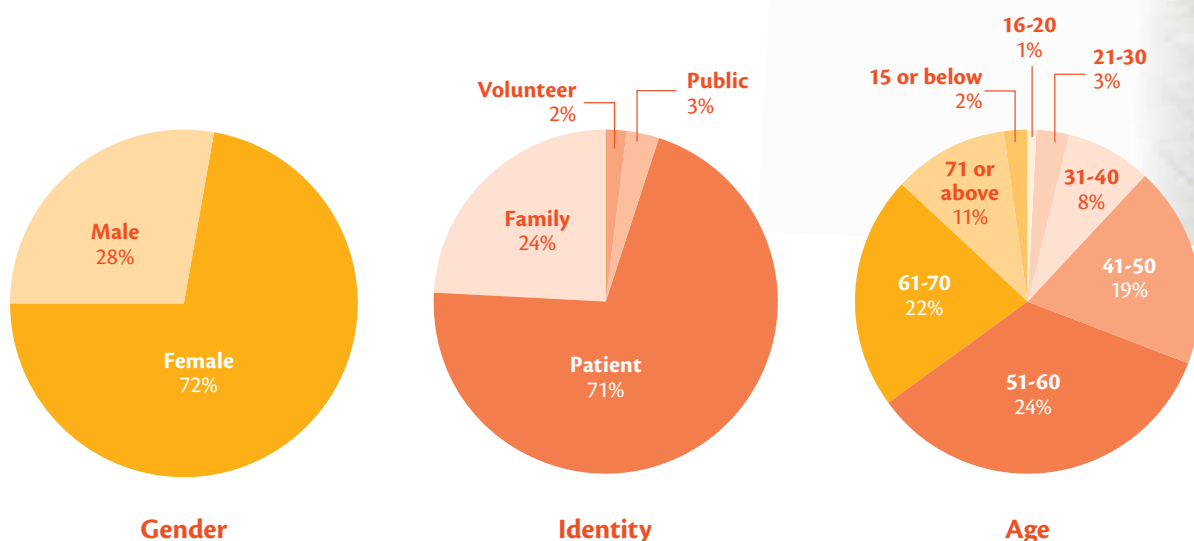
The popularity of our wellness classes continues to grow each year due to these numerous benefits. As a result, we doubled the number of programmes

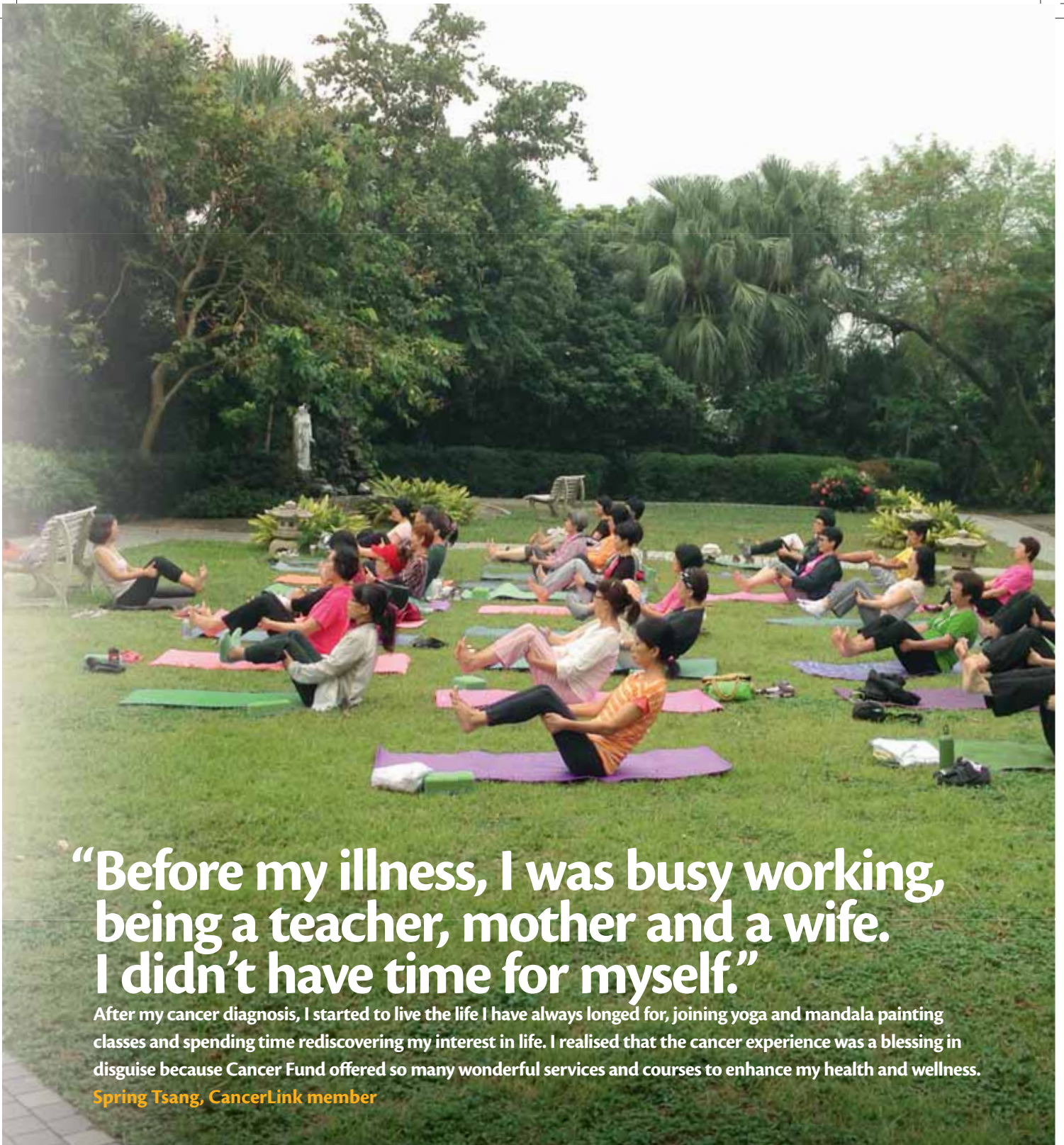
compared to last year. We ran a total of 122 compared to the previous year's 61, an increase of 100%, and increased the number of classes from 522 to 1,007. In total, we had 21,732 visits compared to 13,619 the year before, a rise of 60%.

We are grateful for our volunteer instructors whose dedication, compassion and professionalism have made the programme such a success, and we have been fortunate to partner with the PURE Group who lent their venues to us, so that we can serve as many clients as possible.

The exceptional feedback from our clients and growing demand for our programmes encourage us to continue enhancing our wellness services, and introduce the most cutting-edge techniques to improve quality of life, and confidence of those touched by cancer.

A Debut Performance

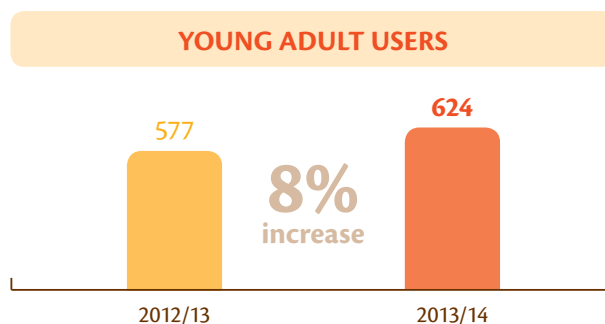
For young adults touched by cancer, we designed unique programmes and activities that empowered youth to embrace positivity, productivity and to focus on making a full recovery. YOU CAN ensures that they receive age-appropriate support to help them face challenges and refocus on everything life has to offer. This year, we reached almost 700 members and the popularity of the group continues to grow as the number of visits rises.

As young people have specific cancer care and support needs, YOU CAN was designed specifically to engage and inspire. We offer workshops relating to relationships, sex and employment, a peer support group, as well as psychotherapeutic and counselling services to engage this demographic.

We have gone to great lengths to keep abreast of our young clients' interests and last year we extended our range of programmes to bring participants together

in team-building activities to inspire mutual support, and adventure leadership training to promote fun and education at the same time.

Young people are the future of our society and we will continue to customise our services so that these clients receive all the support they need during their prime, and ensure that we help to create lasting memories of this exciting time.



PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

In response to the desire for more therapeutic services expressed in our online survey in 2012-2013, this year we offered around 90 programme sessions to benefit almost 700 young adults, from boosting their self-image to enhancing their coping skills through and beyond treatment. To minimise the challenges arising from a cancer diagnosis and improve their quality of life, our psychosocial programmes equipped them to cope with the potential side effects of treatment and encourage them to think positively. The following activities proved to be particularly popular.



ADVENTURE-BASED TRAINING (Therapeutic programme)

Young adults learned problem-solving skills, the power of resilience and how to improve confidence through rock climbing, team building and leadership training. In April 2014, our members organised an Easter programme for Rainbow Club.



DANCING BUDDIES (Psychosocial programme)

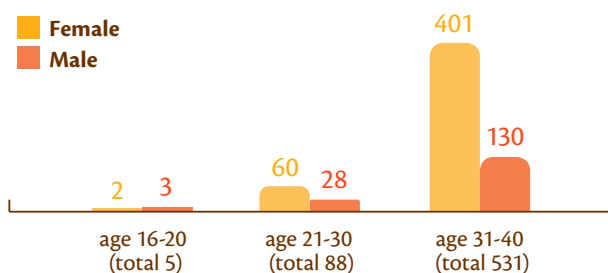
Participants were amazed by how dance could improve physical capability and psychological well-being. In December 2013, the Dancing Buddies invited 60 family and friends to a performance, Dreams Come True, at the Fringe Club in Central, where they showcased the skills they learned at CancerLink. The talented dancers were inspired to put on another show for Stride for a Cure 2014.



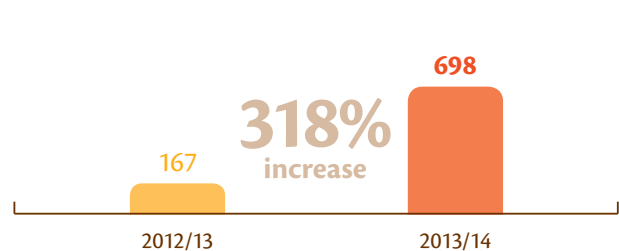
YOU CAN TEA GATHERING (Mutual Support)

Socialising improves quality of life and encourages us to savour each moment. Young adult clients met to take part in a variety of activities such as tea, cooking classes, art jamming, rock climbing and magic, while sharing experiences. These gatherings create a social network for young adult survivors for support and motivate one another in their journey to recovery.

Rainbow Club



This year the number of Rainbow Club programmes increased by 39% compared with last year. We recorded 1,480 active registered users at our three CancerLink support centres, a 21% increase from the year before.

The Rainbow Club helps children who have a family member with cancer or who have lost someone to cancer. Through playful activities and professional support, we help little ones cope with family changes to minimise anxiety and emotional distress. More specifically, the group aims to help parents and children communicate about the impact of the disease in family workshops, offering guidance for parents on how to best communicate with their children during this challenging time.

We create a safe, caring environment where children can build confidence and express themselves through

art classes and games. Our counsellors help them deal with any worries arising from a loved one being affected by cancer. Our mentor programme, Heart-to-Heart, provides one-on-one, practical guidance with homework and assignments to ensure that students are on track with school life.

The Big Brother and Big Sister Programme was a particular highlight receiving significant media coverage about its ability to improve children's self-esteem through mentoring and mutual support. Comprising university student volunteers, it provided emotional and developmental support for children whose family had been affected by cancer. Rainbow Club members created special bonds with their mentors through regular contact, outings and activities, and experienced newfound personal growth.



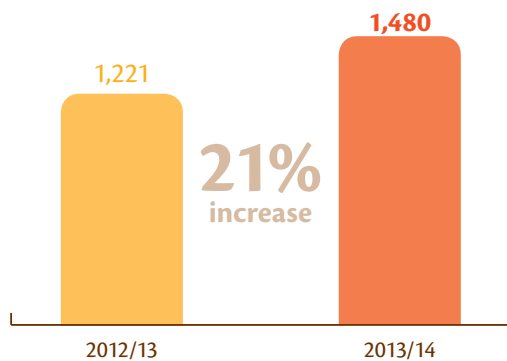
“As a volunteer, the children helped me become a better listener and role model.”

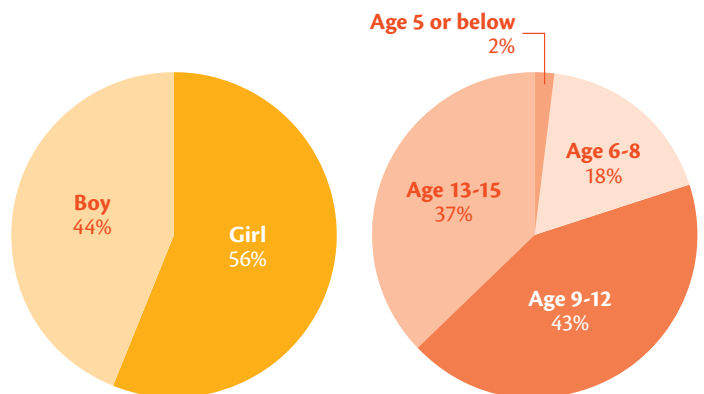

Going Through

Hong Kong's first Prostate Cancer Survivorship Project, Going Through, was launched in December 2013, tailor-made to empower men to overcome the physical and psychological challenges, and sensitive issues around this disease. This programme took a unique, holistic approach to cancer care with clinical professional providing free advice to those touched by prostate cancer.

We provide free integrated and holistic services for clients, their families and carers, including everything from symptom management, peer support, relationship counseling, sexual dysfunction

support and nursing consultations. The programme comprised educational workshops on health, nutrition and well-being, and professional sex therapists were available to answer questions.

This one-of-a-kind programme enhances quality of life and helped clients to better manage treatment and side effects. Speaking with other prostate cancer survivors helped newly diagnosed clients learn ways to cope and the informal gatherings became a good way to meet fellow peers going through a similar experience, who could offer reassurance.

Research Studies

We help to bring cancer under control by funding leading research projects to help prevent, detect and treat the disease.

Genetic Studies of Nasopharyngeal Carcinoma: Cancer of Special Importance in Hong Kong by AoE Center for NPC Research

Cancer Fund funded this project which aims to understand how genetics of the person affected by cancer contributes to the development of NPC and how the genomic changes in the tumor cells impact the development and progress of cancer, to improve the likelihood of successful treatment.

The findings will be translated into clinical applications to detect individuals at high risk for NPC and revolutionise treatment by classifying clients according to predicted tumor behaviour. Identifying people with a higher risk and at an earlier stage of development will enhance the chances of survival and improve quality of life for survivors.

This study is being undertaken at Queen Mary Hospital, Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Pamela Youde Nethersole Eastern Hospital, Princess Margaret Hospital, Tuen Mun Hospital and HK-Shenzhen Hospital.



Development of Small Chemical Molecules, as a Liver Fibrosis Indicator to Prevent Liver Disease and Cancer Progression, Chinese University of Hong Kong

This three-year research project on liver fibrosis and cancer has continued with ongoing support from Cancer Fund, expected to be completed in 2015. During the period under review, the Promyelocytic leukemia (PML) protein was discovered to be a potential target for drug therapy, detailed in a research paper published in March 2013.

Promoting Awareness

Early detection and healthy living are at the heart of our public education campaigns. We helped to build a cancer-smart community in Hong Kong with the following key projects this year.

Skin Cancer Campaign (June 2013)

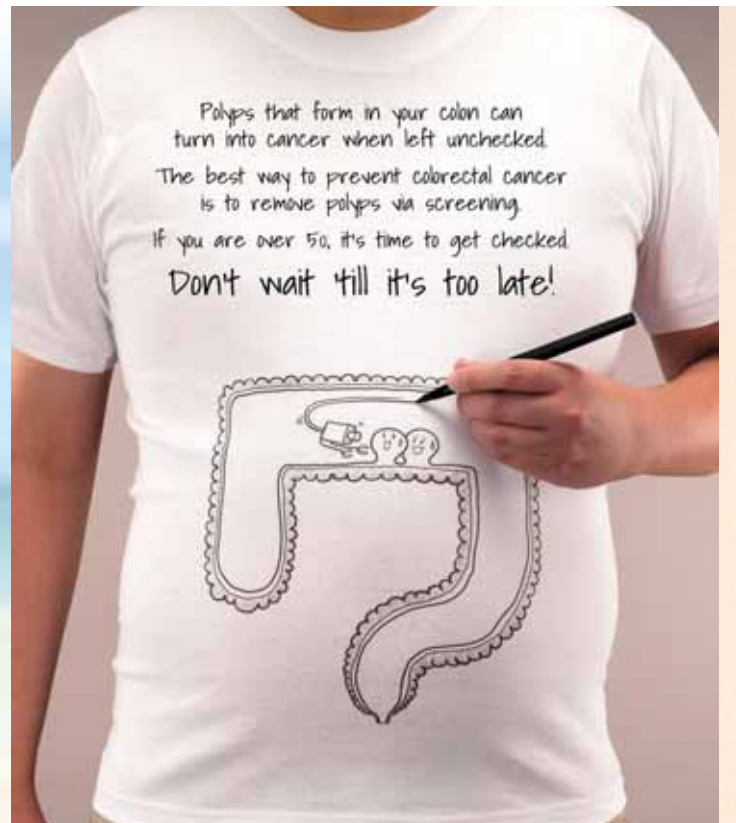
- We launched the new layout design of our SunSmart website, complete with a Facebook game and radio programme archive to further raise awareness
- Our education materials were distributed in over 40 locations, including hospitals, clinics and self-help groups, and mini education leaflets inserted into sunscreen products reaching a targeted audience of 90,000

Colorectal Cancer Campaign (July 2013)

- Website traffic to our mini-site increased by 22% from last year
- Campaign website hits increased over 20% from last year

Breast Cancer Campaign (October 2013)

- As one of Hong Kong's largest breast cancer awareness campaigns, Pink Revolution included print ads, feature editorials and advertorials, radio



- programmes and key visuals displayed in high-traffic MTR stations and bus station shelters
- Press coverage increased by 255% from last year
 - We created a new branded website: pink.cancer-fund.org to highlight the efficacy of our Pink Revolution campaign
 - In a partnership with Hong Kong Sanatorium & Hospital, we offered 500 free mammograms to low-income, high-risk women
 - Campaign website traffic page views increased by 72%

Prostate Cancer Campaign (November 2013)

- We were the official Movember beneficiary again this year
- TV ad banners were shown in 200 Hong Kong clinics
- Campaign website hits increased over 970% from last year

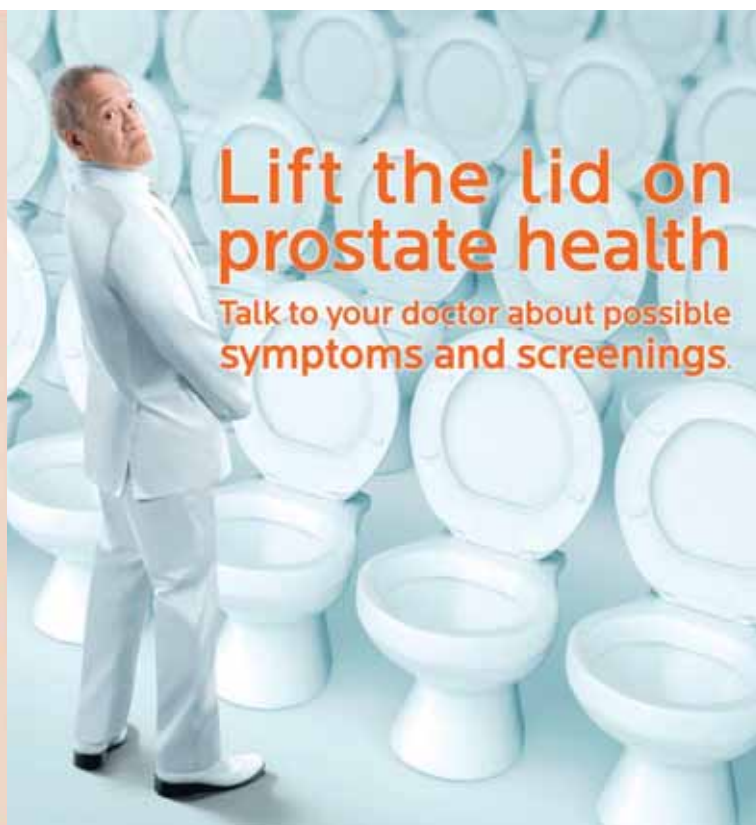
Online Presence

The digital launch of our education campaigns continues to be popular and this year our total webpage views increased by 35% from last year. New visitors to the site also increased by 30% respectively.

On-target Placement in Hospitals

To directly promote our free cancer care services to clients, we placed posters at five designated hospitals featuring relevant messages targeting specific demographics. The posters were placed in 14 panels in five hospitals including Queen Mary Hospital, Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Prince of Wales Hospital, Princess Margaret Hospital and Tuen Mun Hospital. This ongoing, year-round promotion has generated more than 370 enquiries since its first roll-out in December 2012.

Website views increased by 35%.



Engaging the Community

Pink Revolution

Thanks to the help of our Pink ambassador Coco Lee, Cancer Fund's annual Pink Revolution was another great success. Dress Pink Day was a particular highlight with more than 100 corporations and schools who participated on 25 October 2013. We raised nearly HK\$3 million to support women affected by breast cancer.

More than 30 brands donated part of the sale proceeds of their pink items to support our Shop for Pink initiative. Our stand alone events also boosted cancer awareness in the city, at events including Shanghai Tang shopping night and Sassy Mama's October Giveaway.



Stride for a Cure

Our outing this year drew more than 2,500 participants comprising survivors, families and corporate teams to Tai Tam Country Park on 24 November 2013, raising HK\$4.4 million to support local research. Our Run on Your Own programme encouraged our athletic supporters to run for this important cause in their own time and in their chosen venue, and together we raised more than HK\$100,000.





Circle of Friends

Our Circle of Friends who contribute monthly to support our work, continues to be our main source of income. It is thanks to this stable, vital stream of funds that allows us to sustain, improve and widen our free services in the community. Growing this vital group will remain a priority as the more friends we have in our circle, the more people we can help. In 2013, more than **26,000 donors** helped to raise **HK\$47.9 million**.

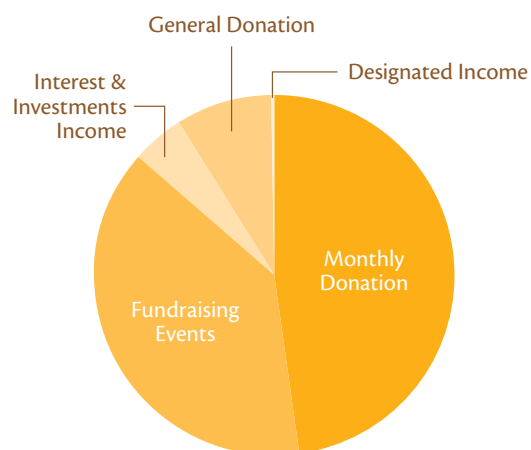
DIY fundraising

Cancer Fund's DIY fundraising has gone from strength to strength. Last year, our supporters raised over **HK\$450,000** through 17 of their own initiatives. The initiative was first established in 2010 and encourages people to create their own activities and host a page on our website to raise money. Anyone can design their own webpage for a special event or activity and invite friends or colleagues to make a donation directly to Cancer Fund. Donors and supporters will be encouraged to execute creative fundraising ideas through our DIY platform.

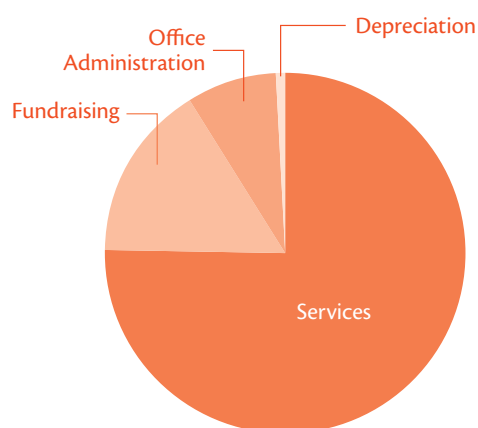
SOURCE OF OVERALL INCOME

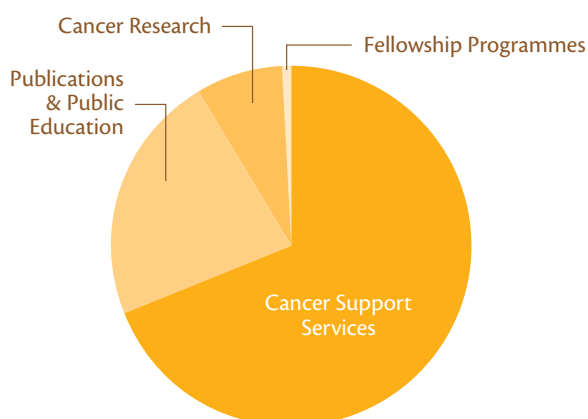
EXPENDITURE DISTRIBUTIONS

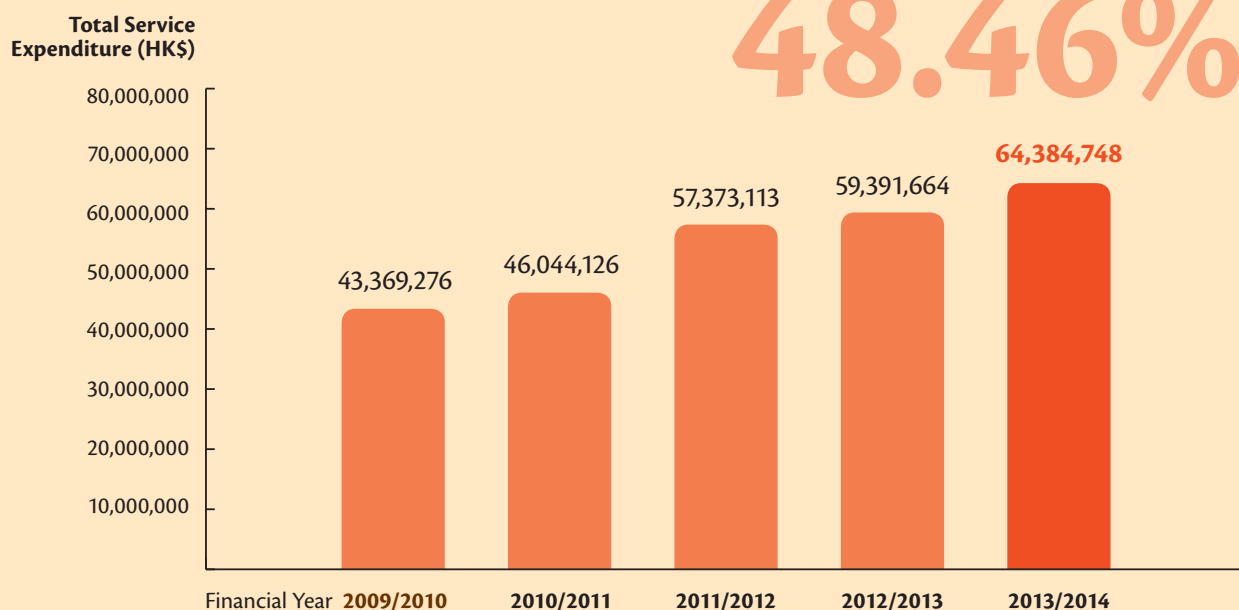
SERVICE DISTRIBUTIONS

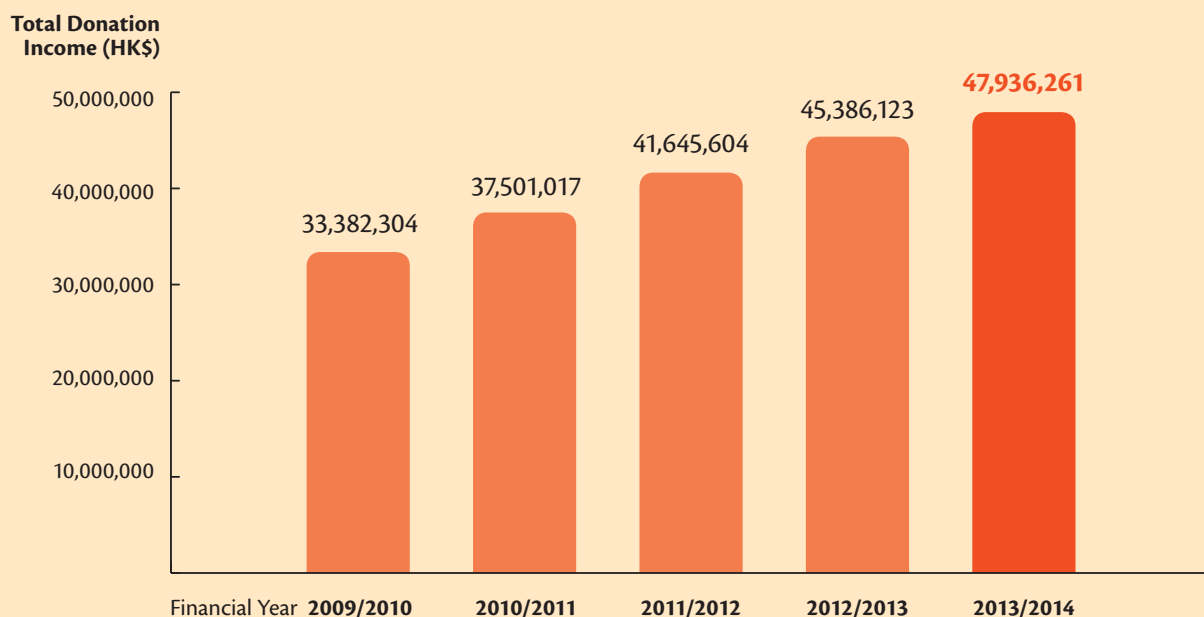


SERVICES: 5 YEAR DEVELOPMENT
