# Hong Kong Cancer Fund Annual Review 2016-2017



## Dear Donors, Supporters and Friends,



This year saw a number of changes for the Hong Kong Cancer Fund as we entered our 30th anniversary year of providing cancer support to the community.

Our network of professional care expanded significantly as we soft-launched a new support centre in Kwai Chung and, due to renovations in The Centre, we also relocated our Central service to North Point.

The consistent number of new users (3,655 in 2016-17) joining Cancer Fund each year is a testament to the planning and effort made to maintain seamless care to those newly diagnosed, along with our existing families living with cancer. In the last year alone, we had 106,000 visits to our CancerLink support centres and over 43,000 attendances at our wellness programmes.

As we grow, so too our responsibility grows to remain leaders in cancer supportive care in Hong Kong. In addition to providing free professional support to our users, Cancer Fund's education campaigns continued to raise awareness of common cancers, prompting millions of people to take action for early diagnosis and adopt healthier lifestyles.

Looking forward, we are especially proud to be co-hosting with the University of Hong Kong the upcoming 20th World Congress of Psycho-Oncology and Psychosocial Academy, a renowned international conference on cancer care. In the lead-up to this event, we remain focused on delivering high quality, best practice support services to our clients, and we look forward to sharing our cancer care model and achievements with our colleagues from around the world.

At Cancer Fund, we value compassion and understanding. We strive to be the bridge in our approach to cancer care; connecting with our community partners, placing our clients' needs at the heart of all we do, and working together as a network of holistic care.

# A Year of Growth



## New Developments

Our CancerLink support centres provide cancer patients, survivors and their families with free multidisciplinary care to meet their practical, physical and emotional needs. This year, CancerLink teams have been planning and making preparations for two new centre locations which were soft-launched in December 2016, ahead of their official opening in 2017.

### Kwai Chung

The new centre will enable us to better reach patients at Princess Margaret Hospital, families living in Kowloon West and New Territories West, and access the 800,000 residents also living in this region. The centre was supported by The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust in providing a fund of over HK\$7.5 million to help establish the centre. We are also grateful to our other sponsors: Fu Tak lam Foundation Limited, Hongkong Bank Foundation, Satinu Resources Group Limited, and our generous donors.

### North Point

Due to renovations by Urban Renewal Authority to The Centre in Central, where our support centre was housed for the past decade, we relocated our service to North Point in December 2016. With this new location, we maintain our service presence on Hong Kong Island and can further extend our reach into East and West Kowloon and the Sai Kung and Eastern Districts.

## Esther's Story

It came as a huge surprise to me, my friends and family when I was diagnosed with breast cancer.

I moved from the Philippines over 20 years ago to work for an IT company and now consider Hong Kong my second home. I have always lived a very active lifestyle: I love yoga, dancing and staying fit, and I keep a healthy diet. So when I first felt a lump in my breast in April 2013, I initially waited to see if it would disappear.

When it didn't, I went to see my doctor. A mammogram and ultrasound showed a suspicious mass so I went for a core biopsy which unfortunately revealed it to be a malignant tumour. I felt surprisingly calm when I heard the news; I think I was trying to be strong for my family who were extremely worried for me.

My approach to my breast cancer was to focus on what needed to be done and I had many questions. I was overwhelmed by decisions; which doctor should I meet, what treatment was best for me and would my insurance cover my medical costs? I spent countless hours researching and talking about my cancer. The most challenging part was the constant feeling of uncertainty, not knowing what would happen next and how it might change my life.

I didn't know anyone close to me who had been through breast cancer and I didn't know where to turn for the information I needed. Thankfully, a friend recommended Cancer Fund.

The team of professionals I met at my local CancerLink support centre provided such helpful information. To this day, I am still learning from my monthly support

group meetings. I learned how to cook and prepare healthier meals and started eating less dairy, less sugar and more whole foods. Peer support has been especially important during my experience; it is quite comforting to be with people who have been through the journey.

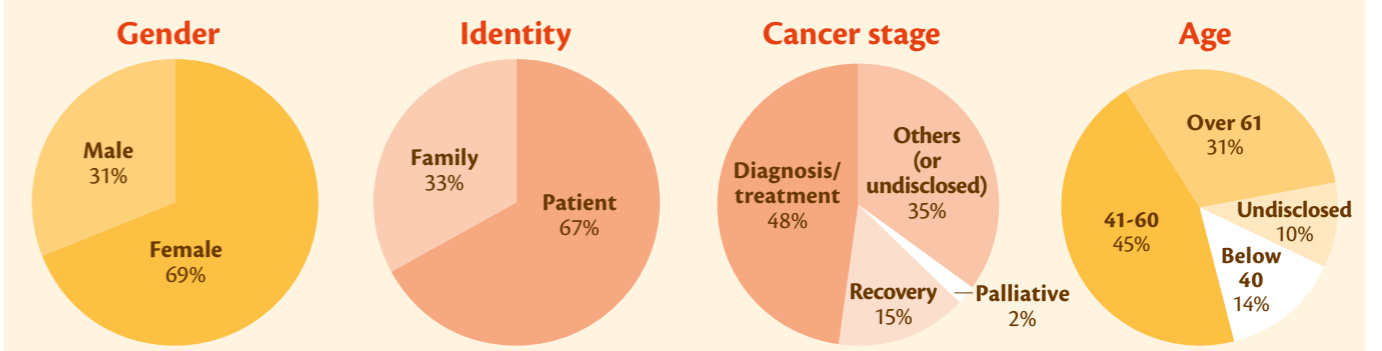
I have also been inspired to share my experience and all that I have learned with friends or colleagues who have been diagnosed. I hope that I can help to alleviate their anxiety and I also encourage others to be aware of their bodies too because early detection does save lives.

It has now been four years since my surgery and treatment but I am still on hormone treatment and have regular checkups and tests. I still feel anxious waiting for my results every time I have follow-up tests and am living with long-term side effects of treatment. I know now that cancer can happen to anyone, so I pay more attention to my body and have any abnormalities checked as early as possible.

Personally, my cancer journey turned out to be a blessing in many ways. I have never felt so loved by my family and friends. It has tested and strengthened my faith, but I have learned to seek the good in a seemingly bad situation. Survivorship and living my 'new normal' has taken adjustment, but I'm so grateful to still be receiving the support I need, and for this second chance to focus on appreciating the good things in life.

## Ling's Story

I don't think anyone is ever really prepared to tell their children about a cancer diagnosis.

As a happy mother of two, I never expected to be diagnosed with colon cancer. At the time, my son was in K1 and daughter was in P4. I was fearful of death and constantly worried about what might happen if my children were left behind. I was also concerned about how cancer would impact my ability to care for them, especially during my surgery and chemotherapy. More than anything I wanted to protect them from feeling afraid.

Thankfully I was introduced to the Cancer Fund. Unlike many other support groups in the community, they offered Rainbow Club – a unique service that helps children adjust to the changes cancer in the family can bring. They guide families through the difficult process of explaining cancer to children of all ages and facilitate ongoing communication to keep relationships open and strong.

It was during Rainbow Club activities that my son Mody learned of my cancer, in a safe and supportive setting. Other children we met also shared his experience and became a good source of peer support. Rainbow Club really helped my young kids to understand cancer in a positive way. Recently, we went to a family drawing workshop which was a significant experience for us. I drew an abstract picture about hair because,

when I was having my chemotherapy, I lost all my hair. I remembered my son hugged me and said, "Mum, I will give you all my hair." I was so touched, that at such a young age, my son was so caring and thoughtful. I am so grateful that CancerLink had helped and supported my family through my cancer journey. Moments like this may seem small, but they made a world of difference in helping our family

to adjust, support each other and face my cancer with strength and understanding. Knowing my children were cared for was one less thing I needed to worry about and I could focus on my treatment, recovery and our plans for the future. I have been so inspired by the help my children and I received during my own cancer experience, that I now volunteer my time and knowledge to other families living with cancer.

I really encourage families affected by cancer to find support in any way they can; be it from social workers, volunteers or peers. No one should go through the cancer journey alone and thanks to Cancer Fund, our family received the support we needed to make it through together.

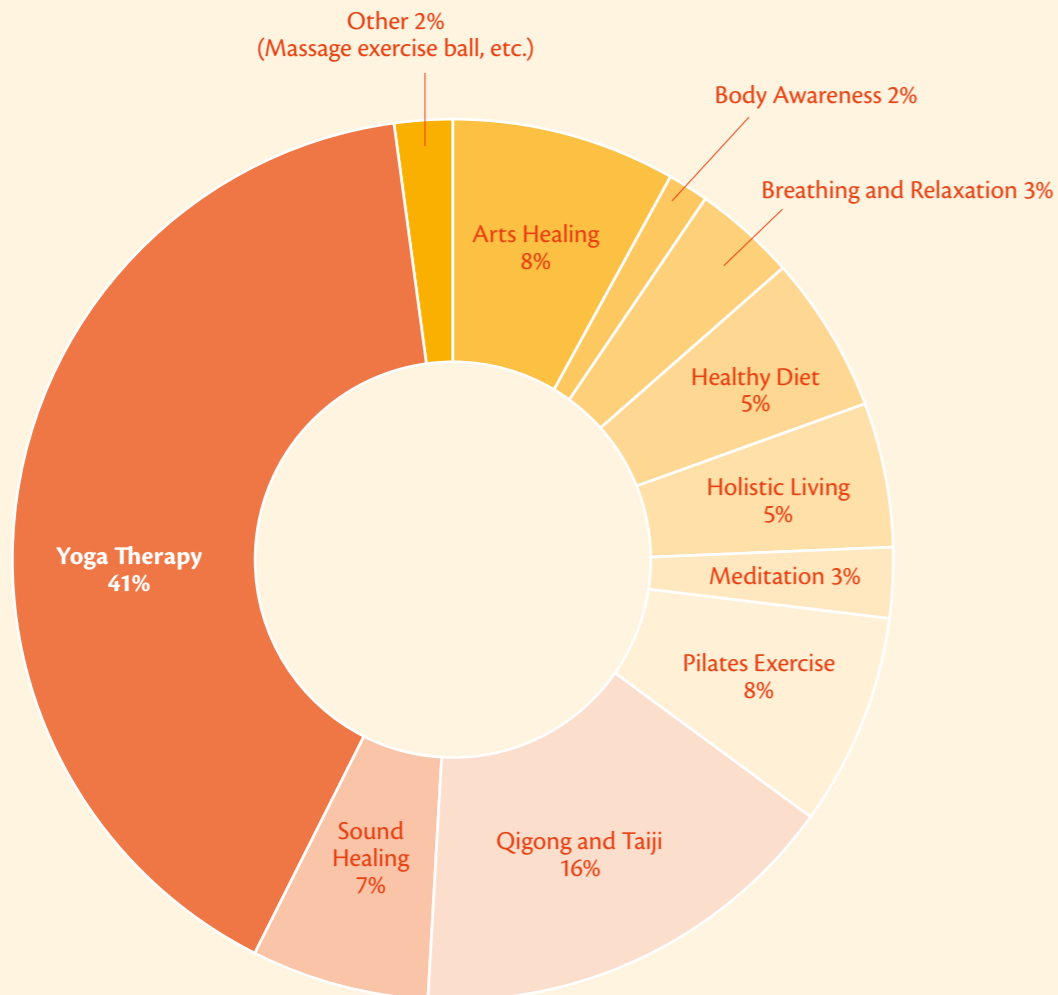

# Raising Awareness

We are living in a community with over 7 million people, and every year over 30,000<sup>^</sup> are newly diagnosed with cancer. Knowing more about cancer is important in building a healthy and cancer aware city. Cancer Fund educates the public on how to lower cancer risk and also the importance of regularly checking for life-saving early diagnosis.

To measure how many people are reached through our education campaigns, we conduct media surveys. These also determine the number of people intending to take action by changing their lifestyle or getting checked after seeing our campaigns.

"I saw Cancer Fund's colorectal cancer awareness poster one day when I was waiting for the bus. The poster highlighted the importance of checking after 50 and, having just celebrated my 50th birthday, I took the initiative to take a colonoscopy. The doctor found four polyps in my colon, which were immediately removed. Later, when I attended a free Cancer Fund health talk, I learned that these polyps can grow to become cancer and I was so grateful I saw the timely advice that helped to eliminate my cancer risk. I am now following Cancer Fund's Facebook fan page where they post various health related messages from time to time. With the new information I have learned about cancer risks, I'm now determined to lead a healthier lifestyle – I exercise regularly, try to lower my alcohol consumption and my whole family is now eating a better range of fruits and vegetables."

# Community Collaboration



## Local Research

The Cancer Fund continues to support local cancer research projects. Through the funding we offer, we are facilitating Hong Kong's doctors, academics and medical specialists to undertake important and life-changing research. Our focus is on local studies which target cancer research for nasopharynx cancer,

colorectal cancer, ovarian cancer, liver fibrosis and cancer symptom management, working towards better outcomes for people living with cancer in Hong Kong.

## A New Study for Women in 2016

**Affordable Multi-gene Mutation-Drug Matching for Recurrent Ovarian Cancer Patients in Hong Kong - The Chinese University of Hong Kong**

Cancer Fund commenced supporting this project in October 2016 with a research grant of HK\$1,000,000. It aims to make multi-gene mutation-drug matching locally available, affordable and relevant for ovarian cancer patients in Hong Kong through expert drug matching to recurrent ovarian cancer patients, and follow-up studies on individual patients who adopt this gene-matched drug treatment. At the same time, this research study will be able to identify the rate of occurrence for potentially drivable cancer mutations found in recurrent ovarian cancer patients in Hong Kong. This research could make a positive impact on the future of precision treatment for local women.

## International Collaboration

For over 30 years, the Cancer Fund has been contributing to the European Organisation for Research and Treatment of Cancer (EORTC). This is an international, non-profit cancer research organisation committed to improving cancer treatments through clinical research and international collaboration. We are proud to be supporting a global movement that we hope will benefit Hong Kong cancer patients and survivors with their developments and innovation in the field of cancer treatment and care.

## Hosting our Global Colleagues

Cancer Fund has been selected to co-host the 20th World Congress of Psycho-Oncology and Psychosocial Academy, which is being held in Hong Kong for the first time in 2018. The theme for this conference will be: Optimising Psychosocial Supportive Services in Cancer Care. We have commenced planning for this exciting opportunity to share our unique service model with our international colleagues and look forward to learning from visiting experts in the field of cancer supportive care.

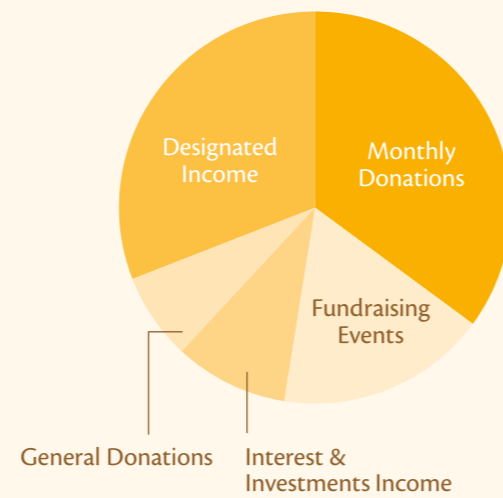


## Source of Overall Income

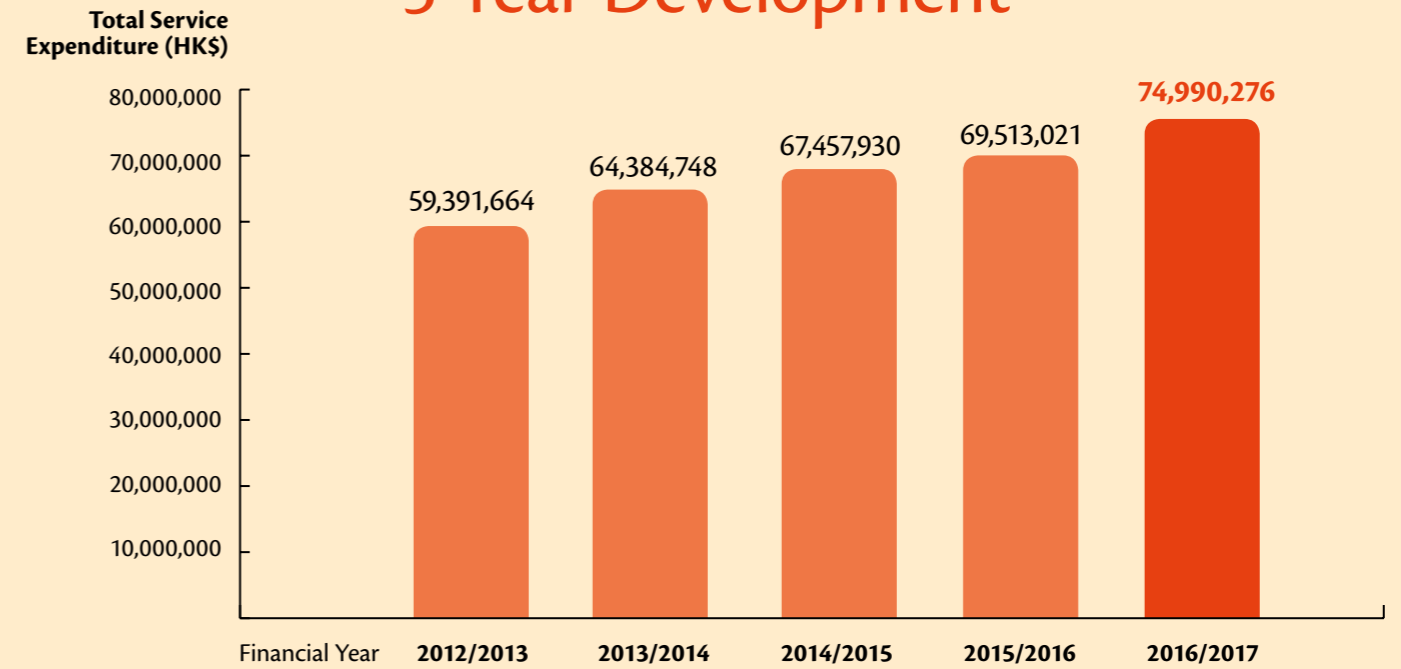

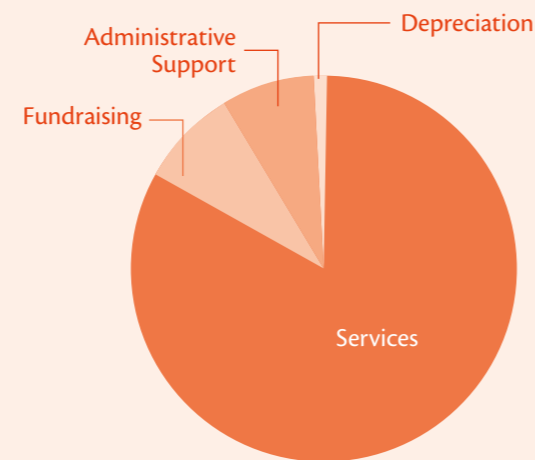
## Services: 5 Year Development



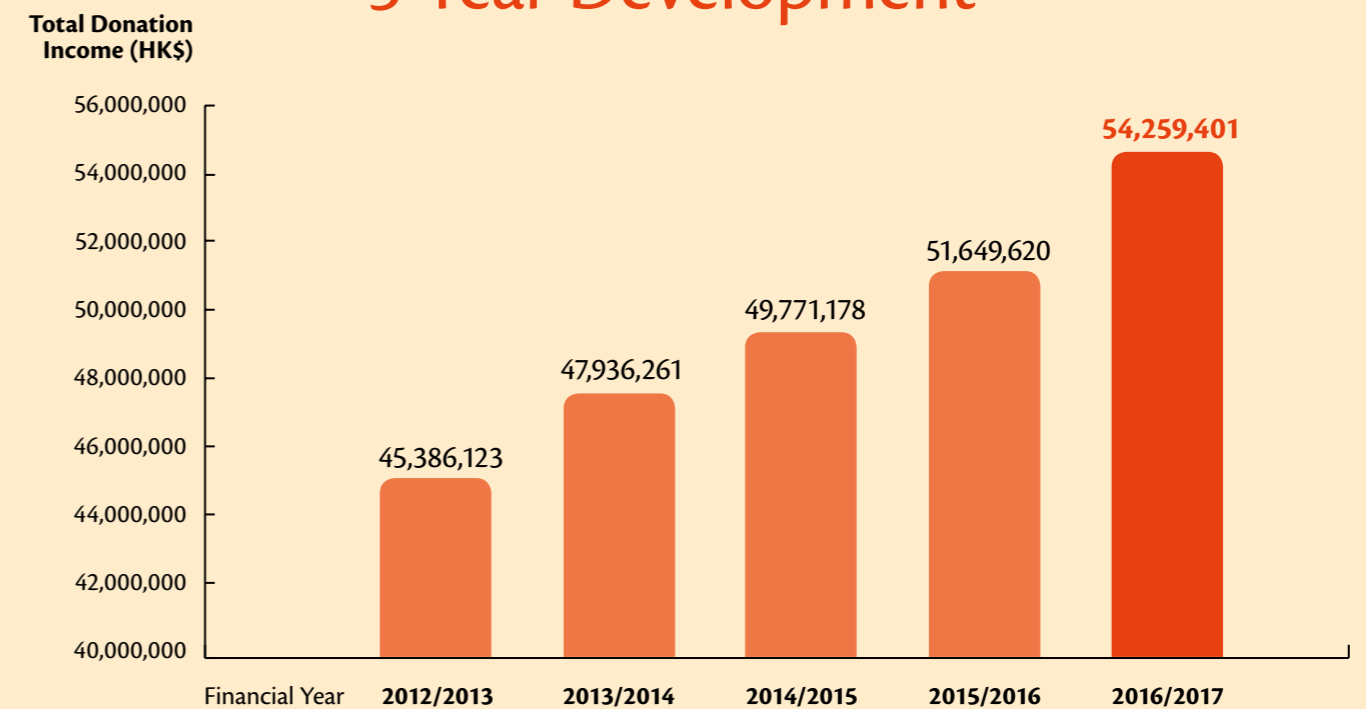
## Expenditure Distributions

**Total Expenditure** **HK\$93,029,495**



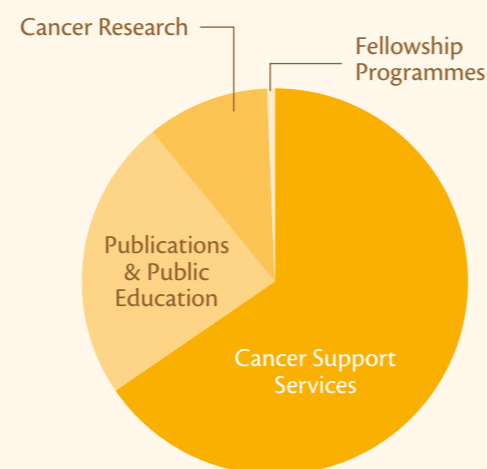
## Monthly Donations: 5 Year Development
