Turning Experience into Hope

Behind every smile, reassuring conversation and helping hand at the Hong Kong Cancer Fund is a volunteer who truly understands the cancer journey. Across our Cancer Support centres and programmes, approximately 700 volunteers generously give their time to support others facing cancer, many having experienced the anxiety, uncertainty and heartbreak of the illness themselves, either as patients, caregivers, loved ones or healthcare professionals. Recently, the Cancer Fund held a Volunteer Appreciation Day to celebrate and thank these remarkable individuals for their compassion and dedication. Awards were presented to volunteers who have given outstanding service to the organisation and the cancer community. While this feature highlights the stories of three inspiring award recipients, they represent just a small part of a much larger volunteer family whose kindness touches countless lives every day. Through listening, encouraging and simply being there for others, these volunteers turn personal hardship into hope, strength and comfort for people navigating some of life's most difficult moments.

Mr Mark MAK – Caregiver Volunteer



"I wanted her to know she would never face this alone."

When Mr Mark Mak's wife was diagnosed with breast cancer, he made a quiet promise to her: they would face the journey together. Through every hospital visit, chemotherapy and difficult moment, he remained by her side, offering comfort, patience and unwavering support. One memory remains especially close to his heart — the day treatment caused her hair to fall out. Wanting her to feel less alone, Mark sat beside her and shaved his own head too. Looking at each other afterwards, the couple burst into laughter and even took a photo to remember the moment. "I wanted her to know she would never face this alone," he says.

After receiving support from the Hong Kong Cancer Fund, Mark began volunteering at the Wong Tai Sin Centre to help others walking a similar path. Even after a devastating fire destroyed his family home last year, he continued serving others with remarkable positivity and resilience. For Mark, family, love and simply being together matter far more than material things.

Even while undergoing cancer treatment herself, Ms Anissa Leung chose to reach out and support others facing the same fears and uncertainty. Refusing to let cancer take away her spirit, she continued working, travelling and staying active throughout treatment, believing that strength begins with helping yourself. “If you don’t help yourself, it’s very hard for others to help you,” she says.

After retiring, a rise in her cancer markers briefly left her feeling overwhelmed and uncertain about the future. But through joining activities at the Hong Kong Cancer Fund, she found friendship, encouragement and

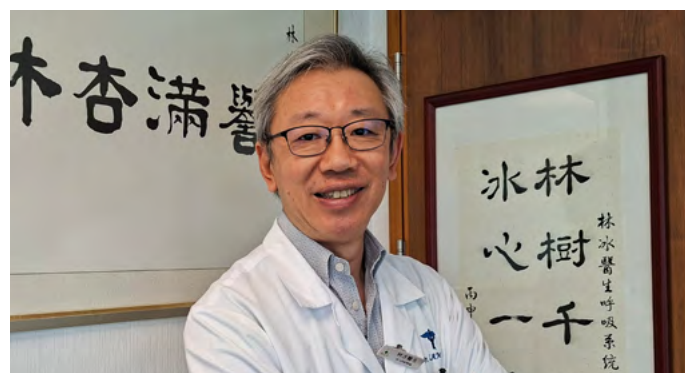
a renewed sense of purpose. Today, she openly shares her story with fellow patients, offering comfort through genuine understanding and empathy. Having faced relapse three times herself, her words carry powerful meaning when she tells others, “I’m still standing here. I would like to thank my husband for his amazing and loving support so I can continue to do the things I like and be able to balance my family, health, interest and volunteer work”

Volunteering has become part of her own healing journey, reminding her that she still has so much to give while bringing hope and reassurance to others.

Dr LAM Bing – Professional Volunteer

For more than two decades, Dr Lam Bing has quietly dedicated his time and expertise to supporting cancer patients and families through the Hong Kong Cancer Fund. Beyond providing medical advice, he offers something many people need just as much during difficult times — reassurance, patience and hope.

Through regular pro bono consultations, Dr Lam listens carefully to patients’ fears about diagnoses, treatment options and the uncertainty that cancer can bring. He believes every patient deserves the time to ask questions, feel heard and leave with greater peace of mind. “Patients should never feel they are facing cancer alone,” he says.

15 Years of Wellness:

Caring for the Whole Person Through Cancer

This year, we're celebrating something very special, 15 years of holistic support at Hong Kong Cancer Fund that has grown into a vibrant and caring community reaching tens of thousands of people each year.

What started in 2011 as a small idea, inspired by our Founder and Chief Executive Sally Lo, has blossomed into something truly meaningful. Back then, Sally recognised something deeply important: that cancer care shouldn't stop at medical treatment. While medicine treats the body, the experience of cancer touches every part of a person's life.

That belief became the heart of what we offer and it still guides us today.

We introduced our Wellness and Holistic Health Care Service with a clear and compassionate purpose, to support people not only physically, but emotionally and mentally throughout their cancer journey.

Cancer treatment is vital but it is only one part of the story. A diagnosis often brings anxiety, exhaustion, and uncertainty. Many people find themselves navigating not just the side effects of treatment, but also the emotional side that comes with it. This is why these programmes are so important as they help bridge the gap between medical care and overall well-being.

All classes are provided completely FREE of charge, ensuring that anyone touched by cancer can access support without financial burden.





From humble beginnings with just few programmes, the service has grown into 11 types of mindfulness-based programmes.

Today, it stands as the largest holistic wellness service provider for cancer care in Hong Kong, supporting tens of thousands of attendances each year.

This growth reflects both the increasing need for whole-person care and the meaningful impact these programmes have made:

* Sessions have increased from 283 to more than 2,000

* Attendance has risen from 7,494 to over 40,000 each year

Beyond in-person sessions, the service has also expanded online, with 125 videos and over 10 million views, making support accessible anytime, anywhere.

These classes are about more than activities, they are about empowerment. Participants learn how to calm their minds, listen to their bodies, and regain a sense of control. They discover ways to cope with treatment, improved sleep, and find peace of mind in the midst of uncertainty.

"Thank you to the wellness facilitator for the encouragement. With each class, I can feel gradual improvements in my body. Although progress is slow and pain sometimes affects me, I believe I will continue to improve and become healthier."

For many, it becomes an essential part of their healing journey, not replacing medical care, but complementing it in a deeply human way. It is a reminder that healing is not just about medicine, but also about nurturing strength, connection, and hope.

From Marathons to Meaning – Miles of Generosity for Cancer Patients

At 71, Mr. Tam Chi-keung is still lacing up his running shoes, but this isn't just about fitness. It's about purpose, giving back, and inspiring others. Before retirement, Mr. Tam worked as a medical social worker in the oncology department at Queen Elizabeth Hospital. Witnessing the struggles of cancer patients firsthand, he wanted to find a way to support them beyond his daily work.

"I first came to know about Hong Kong Cancer Fund during my career and often introduced patients for support," he recalls. After retiring, he wondered how he could continue making a difference. Running became his answer. Inspired by a book that suggested everyone should run a full marathon at least once in a lifetime, he trained rigorously, completing his first marathon at 55 and eventually six full marathons by age 60.

In 2015, he transformed his passion into a remarkable act of generosity: the solo "A Little Run Around Taiwan for Charity," covering 930 kilometers in 40 consecutive days. Over the years, he continued with runs around Hong Kong and Macau, each journey raising funds and awareness for Hong Kong Cancer Fund.

Ten years later, his spirit of giving brought him back to Taiwan, this time with a team. The "A Little Run Around Taiwan for Charity 2.0" in December 2025 welcomed 40 participants, including 25 from Hong Kong and Macau, 15 from Taiwan, and 15 cancer survivors. Together, they ran 14 scenic segments of approximately 20 kilometers each, starting and ending at Taipei's Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall.

All donations went directly to Hong Kong Cancer Fund. Mr. Tam personally covered all logistical costs, ensuring that every dollar raised supports patients in need. "Even if no one else joined, I had my wife and daughters by my side," he says. Their unwavering support accompanied him throughout the run, highlighting the power of family and community.

Among the participants were a remarkable couple from our Wong Tai Sin Cancer Support Centre. Mr. Tam had met the husband during a previous “Little Run.” This time, both he and his wife joined the Taiwan run. The wife had never been a runner before, so they trained together in Hong Kong beforehand. Watching them complete the run, side by side, was a moving testament to determination, teamwork, and the courage of cancer survivors.

Participants ranged widely in age, from Mr. Tam’s daughter in her twenties to his friend Peter, 71, a cancer patient who helped with local arrangements. Every day began at 5 a.m., with running starting at 7:30 a.m., followed by lunch and some rest before the next day’s segment. Despite the physical challenge, everyone supported each other with great resilience and camaraderie.

Reflecting on his journey, Mr. Tam shares:

“Never consider a good deed too small to do, for in doing good, we find the greatest joy.”

His story is a reminder that one person’s action, small or huge, can inspire a community, raise funds for those in need, and show that life after retirement can be full of meaningful achievements. We hope that Mr. Tam’s run will encourage others to find their own way to make a difference.





Breathing Easier:

Turning Awareness into Action Against Lung Cancer

For many people in Hong Kong, the words “lung cancer” carry a profound weight. It remains the most common cancer in our city, with more than 6,000 people newly diagnosed in 2023. That means every day, 17 individuals begin a journey they never expected, one that can feel uncertain, overwhelming, and deeply personal for both patients and their loved ones.

One of the greatest challenges with lung cancer is that it is often detected late. More than half of patients are diagnosed at stage IV, when treatment options are more limited. Yet there is also a powerful message of hope. When lung cancer is found early, at stage I, the five-year survival rate can be as high as 70% with appropriate treatment. This remarkable difference reminds us that early detection is not just important; it can be life-changing.

Lung cancer may be serious, but it is not without hope. With greater awareness, vigilance, and timely medical attention, we can shift the narrative, from late discovery and limited options to one of resilience, recovery, and renewed life.

Supporting Every Step of the Journey

At the Cancer Fund, we are dedicated to walking alongside patients and caregivers at every stage of the lung cancer journey. Our tailored programmes provide both practical support and emotional care.

These include the “Adaptation Group Gathering” for newly diagnosed patients, “Dialogue with Doctors – New Trends in Lung Cancer,” and “Dietetic Sharing” sessions for those undergoing treatment or moving into survivorship.

Beyond in-person programmes, we provide accessible online resources, including videos on “Breathing Exercises for Supporting Lung Health” and “Breathing and Relaxation.” These are designed to offer comfort, guidance, and a sense of control throughout the journey.

Understanding Lung Cancer and Its Risks

Lung cancer is broadly divided into two types: small cell lung cancer (SCLC) and non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC), with NSCLC accounting for the majority of cases. Many are linked to genetic mutations, particularly among non-smokers, who now make up around 40% of lung cancer patients.

While smoking remains a key risk factor, other contributors include air pollution, secondhand smoke, radon exposure, asbestos, and family history. This evolving understanding reminds us that lung cancer is not solely a smoker’s disease.

Those at higher risk, due to age, smoking history, family background, or chronic respiratory conditions, should remain especially attentive to their lung health and seek medical advice when needed.

Listening to Your Body

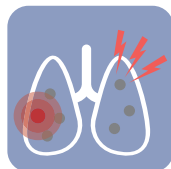
In its early stages, lung cancer often develops silently. However, certain symptoms should not be ignored:



Persistent coughing or coughing up blood



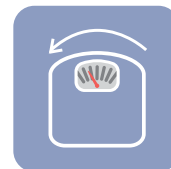
Breathlessness



Repeated chest infections



Hoarseness



Unexplained weight loss



Fatigue

If you notice any of these signs, it is important to consult a doctor promptly. Early attention can make a crucial difference.

With continued advancements in treatment and a stronger focus on early detection, there is real reason for hope. Together, through awareness, education, and support, we can help more people face lung cancer with strength, and move forward with confidence and care.
